

What is GDPR?

GDPR stands for General Data Protection Regulation 2018. This leaflet explains in simple terms, why your personal data is collected as part of GDPR and how your personal data is stored.

What is Personal Data?

Any information about you that can be used to identify you

Why does DMNW collect personal data?

Our main reason for collecting your data is 'Legal Obligation': Our funders need details of how many people we have worked with on our projects and we collect information about you so that we can identify individual people.

What do we do with your personal data?

Our data is stored on a database We only ever provide information about you to our funders that is anonymised.

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What are my rights?

- a) The right to be informed;
- b) The right of access;
- c) The right to rectification;
- d) The right to erasure (also known as the 'right to be forgotten');
- e) The right to restrict processing;
- f) The right to data portability;
- g) The right to object;
- h) Rights with respect to automated decision-making and profiling.

How do I complain?

If you feel that your data has been breached in line with GDPR then you can request a copy of DMNW complaints policy or, alternatively, lodge a formal complaint direct with the Independent Commissioners Office by calling 0303 123 1113.
